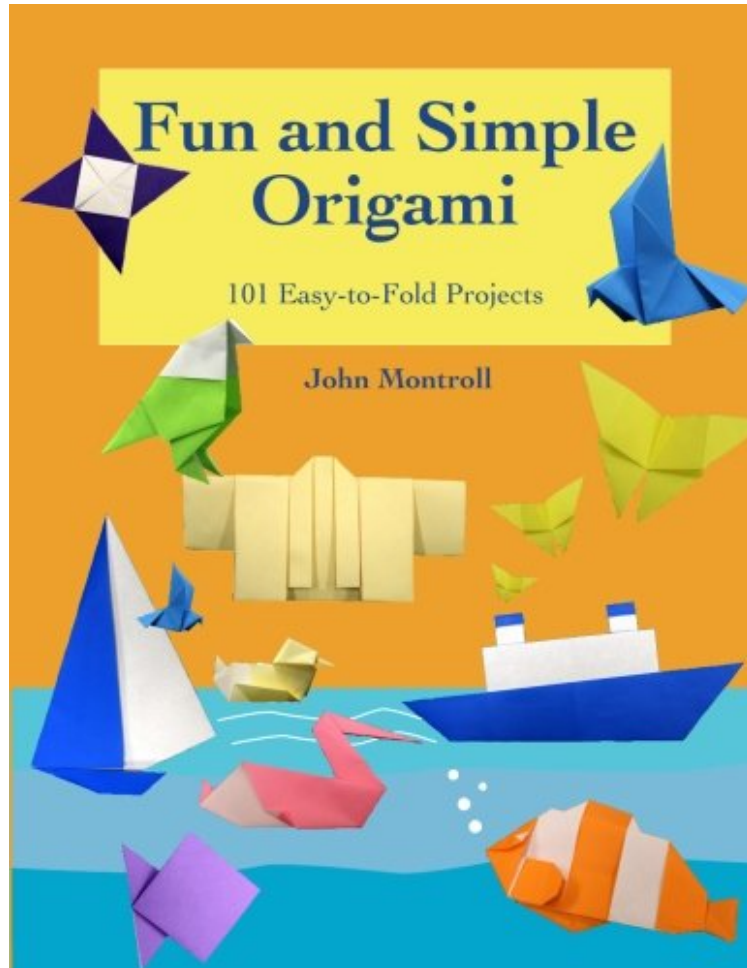

My standard book for the kids is Montroll's "Easy Origami". This is that book beefed up with many more interesting models you could consider for your first origami book. In Easy Origami start at the front of the book and work your way back. Consider it a computer game with levels...Origami is best learned from watching someone do it FIRST...then going to your book to remember what you saw. Kids learn to read the diagrams (which are an international convention BTW) that way. Find a model in the book you like, then look it up on YouTube. There are some fantastic teachers there. Then go back to the book. Fairly quickly you will be able to visualize the moves from looking at the diagram. All origami books are not presented well...fancy does not translate into easier to follow. Montroll's books are excellent, no matter what level of
