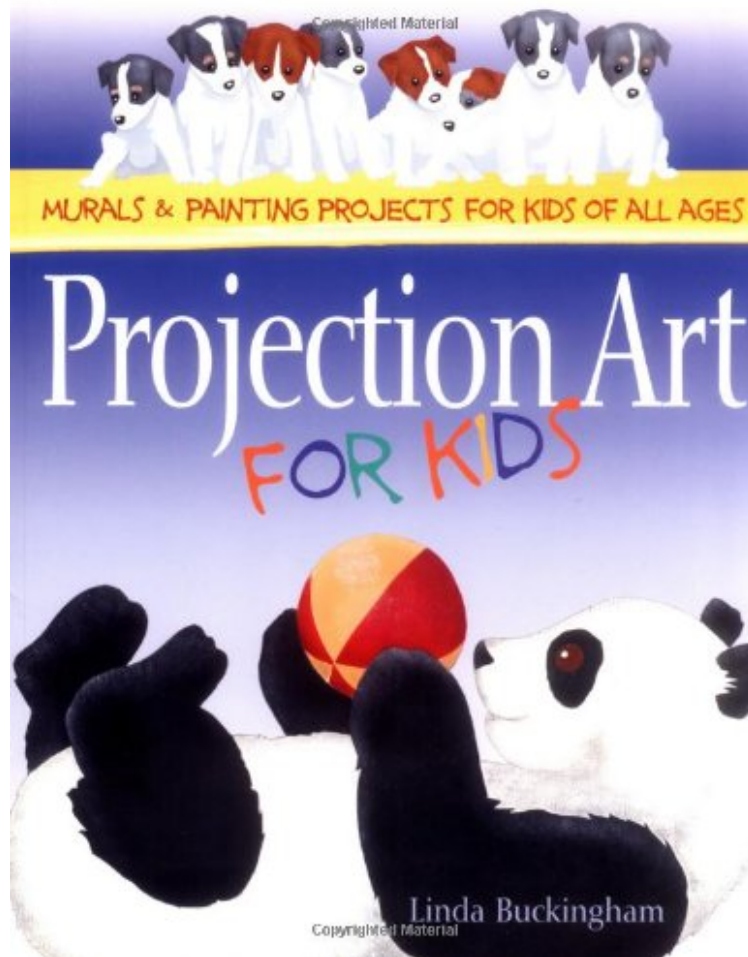

Carefully following the instructions in this book, I was able to create an African savanna scene on the wall of my son's room, complete with acacia trees, life-size zebras, and elephants. It took a little practice (which I did on a closet wall where no one would see my mistakes). The projection stenciling technique is perfect for anyone wanting to create some great-looking mural-sized art. I do recommend buying a projector, as this makes it very easy to transfer the pictures in the book to your wall. The only reason I did not give this book 5 stars is because I found that the author's recommendation to use freezer paper with stenciling adhesive was very messy, difficult, and left adhesive on my wall that was difficult to remove. After some experimentation, I discovered that I could use white shelf paper (I used Henkel self-stick easy liner) for the projection stenciling technique, and it works perfectly, involves no mess or fumes, and peels cleanly from the wall when finished. All in all, a great book with some really nice project ideas.

Even people who think they have no talent for visual art can create eye-catching murals using the simple projection art techniques described in this book. Covering projection, tracing, painting techniques, and the use of paint pens, the book includes projects for nurseries, daycare centers, and childrens and teenagers rooms. Readers learn how to create a transportation mural, re-create a favorite map on a wall or floor, and transform a bedroom into a princess suite. Color photos and illustrations throughout are provided.
