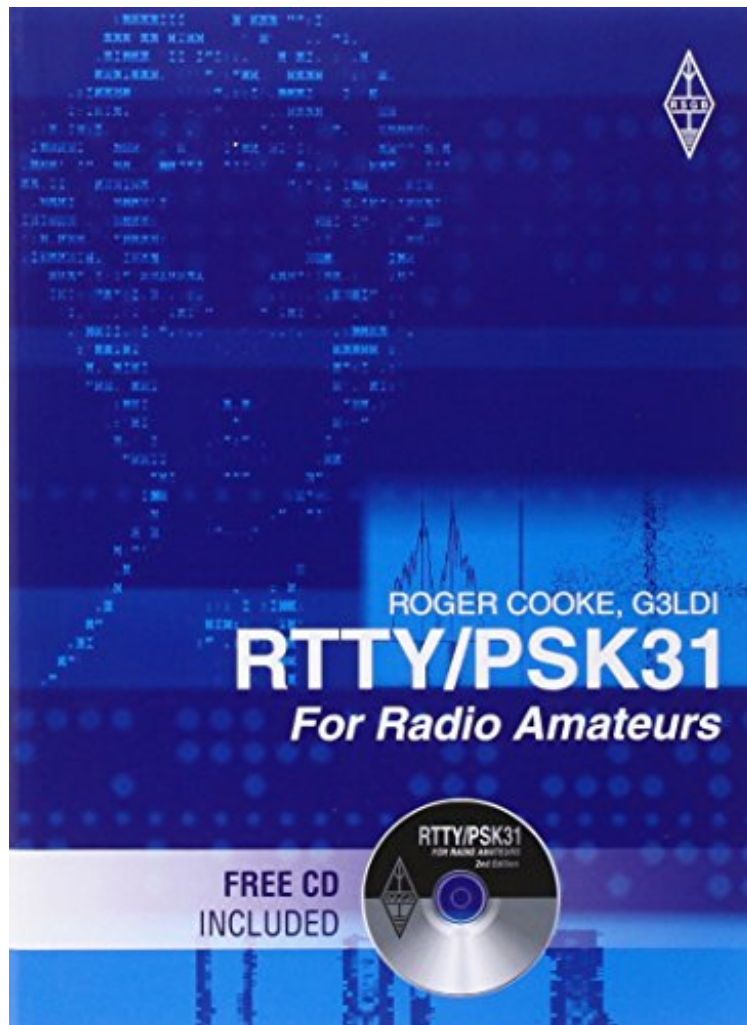

Tompson This 48 page pamphlet is a very summary level description of RTTY and PSK31. Approximately 80% of the space is devoted to RTTY. It will not do a lot to help you actually get on the air. It will not do very much to help you understand the electronics of PSK, how a sound card works, why the PSK signal is robust and easily decoded in a noisy environment, or much at all about it. It will not help you decide between the various interfaces available for purchase. The "Free CD" is a collection of interesting articles and software. Most are easily downloaded from the

internet. My copy of the CD is defective; it causes the R/W heads to continuously move from spot to spot, taking very long times to read the information on the CD and wearing the heads unnecessarily. Save your money. (Update July 2014: the item is no longer available on)
