All of the models are fun and would be easy enough for kids while being fun for adults as well. I was amused to see the model I know as a cup used as a hat. I'd never thought of making it big enough to fit a head and turning it upside down but it would make a great hat so that's a new idea. The book has brief sections on how the various folds in the book are diagrammed and the types of paper needed and also a page on other ideas for using the models. And each model is illustrated by a beautifully presented mix of drawings and photos. The models are: * hats* glider* fox family* snapping mouths* snake fangs* big bang* jumping frogs* windmills* beads* star box* bombs away/waterbomb* lily* flapping bird* Christmas tree* starMy favourite new model is the fox family. It's more a suggestion of a fox rather than a realistic model and the author has photographed a few of the foxes in different paper designs which

makes them look really cool. And it's a simple model that almost anyone could fold. Recommended for ages 6+.
